Attendance Make Up Sessions

It makes sense and research shows that it is true - students with good attendance are more successful in school. Chronic absenteeism is directly related to many challenges within the school setting, including lack of academic success and ultimately, an increased risk of dropping out. At FSI, middle school students with 20 or more absences may be retained. High school students cannot earn credit in classes in which they have 5 or more unexcused absences. Excessive tardies may also be considered as a factor in determining whether a student will be promoted or earn credit.

We offer Attendance Make Up Sessions for students with high numbers of absences. Each hour of Attendance Make Up will count as 1 class absence. Students must bring homework or a book to read; cell phones and electronic devices will not be allowed. Students will have access to school

Chromebooks for purposes of completing homework assignments. There is a \$5 fee for each Attendance Make Up Session.

How to Use Canvas

There are two options for using Canvas as a parent.

1. Use the Canvas App for Parents

- Download the Canvas App for your device (it is free)
- Create an account. You will enter your email address, and select a password

- You will be prompted to add a student. Search for The Franklin School of Innovation. You will then be asked for your student's UID and password. All students have been given their UID and passwords, and have received training on how to log on. Ask your student!
- If your student does NOT know how to log into Canvas, we can help. Please check with your student before you email for help. Email me if your student cannot help you log on.

2. Log onto Canvas (you will find a <u>link to Canvas</u> on our website!) with your student - you can create a parent account, but you will need your student's log in information to create your account. Log on with your student and ask them to show you their courses, assignments, and grades. You determine how often you want/need to log on with your student.

If you have a question about your student's grade in any specific class, please reach out to that teacher. They can best help you understand how your student is doing.
