This is a significant gift, valued at \$1.5 million, and we are deeply grateful to The Glass Foundation for their generosity and their vote of confidence. Formalizing this transfer represents a significant step in our work towards securing financing for a permanent facility. Many thanks to the members of our Board of Directors who persisted through this process!

As we continue to strengthen the school's financial standing, we also are excited by our academic growth. You may have seen this article in the Asheville Citizen Times, and wondered how Franklin compares. We are pleased to see the hard work of our students and faculty reflected in our "B" grade! Last year, we set a school-wide goal focused on raising student achievement in math. We exceeded our goal, and saw a great step up in our math scores! We are raising the bar higher this year.

We know that the academic growth of our students reflects your support as parents, and we look forward to another great year of growth together. As we think about growth, I look forward to welcoming you all for our Student Led Conferences on October 25!

How to Use Canvas

Have you heard about Canvas? Perhaps you aren't sure what this is? Canvas is a Learning Management System that we use to help students keep up to date with coursework, assignments, and their progress in class. As a parent, you can log in to see how your student is doing. You will need information from your student to log in the first time. All students have received this information. With the end of Q1 approaching (October 30), now is a good time to check in.

There are two options for using Canvas as a parent.

- 1. Use the Canvas App for Parents
 - Download the Canvas App for your device (it is free)
 - Create an account. You will enter your email address, and select a password
 - You will be prompted to add a student. Search for The Franklin School of Innovation. You will then be asked for your student's UID and password. All students have been given their UID and passwords, and have received training on how to log on. Ask your student!
 - If your student does NOT know how to log into Canvas, we can help. Please check with your student before you email for help. Email me if your student cannot help you log on.
- 2. Log onto Canvas (you will find a <u>link to Canvas</u> on our website!) with your student. Ask your student to log on and show you Canvas. You can ask them to take you on a tour of their courses, and check assignments and grades. You can determine how often you want/need to log on with your student.

If you have a question about your student's grade in any specific class, please reach out to that teacher. They can best help you understand how your student is doing.

Student Led Conferences - October 25

Students in all grades have begun work preparing for the fall Student Led Conferences (SLCs). Every student will complete an SLC; our goal is to have parent/guardian participation for every student. We dedicate the entire school day to SLCs. **Students will come to school for their designated SLC time;** they will not be in school the rest of the day. Please plan ahead for this day! Your student's Crew leader will send out a schedule to sign up for a time for the SLC.

What are SLCs, and why are they so important? At Franklin, we believe in putting students at the center of their learning. Teachers and parents have important supporting roles, but students are the stars. The

SLC is one way we shift to put students in the lead. In the traditional parent-teacher conference, there is no place for student voice and ownership. In the SLC, students present evidence of what they have learned, and they share their goals for the year. Crew leaders and parents/guardians listen, ask questions, and learn how we can help students reach their goals. If you are new to Franklin, I encourage you to <u>watch this video</u> and see an SLC in action in another EL Education school.

In addition to academic goals, students will reflect on their Habits of Scholarship. As a faculty last year, we mapped out a <u>Continuum</u> of learning targets for our Habits of Scholarship - in other words, what each Habit of Scholarship looks like at each grade level. For the fall SLCs, students will evaluate themselves on their Habits of Scholarship. I encourage you to take a look at the <u>Continuum</u>, and think about how you can support your student show growth in their Habits of Scholarship.

PSAT @ Franklin, Saturday, October 14, 8 am

We have a few slots open for the PSAT! The PSAT is generally taken by students in 10th or 11th grade, and is used to determine eligibility for national scholarships, like the National Merit Scholar program. It's also a chance for students in earlier grades to gain experience on a college-entrance exam. The fee is \$30.
